Aims

The Plastic Arts degree at Jean Monnet University gives students the fundamental techniques and ideas in plastic arts through the practice of different media (drawing, painting, sculpture, engraving, infographics, video, photography, performance) and a theoretical approach to art history, art sciences, aesthetics, film theory and the new media.

The ALL field is organised in two portals, "Arts" (Plastic Arts and Musicology) and "Literature and Languages". The "Arts" and "Literature and Languages" portals are based on four types of skills, which are essentially interdisciplinary and linguistic, helping to make reorientation easier.

Admission

Skills

§ Designing and producing artistic objects: drawing, engraving, sculpture, photographs, sound creation, performance, installations (...).

§ Designing and producing multimedia and interactive digital works.

§ Thinking in theoretical, historical and analytical terms about contemporary artistic practices.

§ Organising and setting up exhibitions.

§ Staging performances and artistic installations: video performance, sound installations, interactive and multimedia installations.

After the course

Continuing studies

§ The course prepares students for master's degrees with the "Arts" and "Design" options, typically leading to work immediately or to the research professions.

§ The MEEF (teaching) master's degree is another option after this course.
