The AlterEurope Master provides a **specialisation in the European Union's neighbour states** by focusing on their place in EU policies and, more broadly, in terms of globalisation and international geopolitics.

The AlterEurope Master is for **four student profiles** singled out for their solid background (Bachelor's degree) in geography, business/management, political science or law to whom it provides training in the **European Union's neighbour states, both east and south**, and the relationships they have with the EU and other international European bodies with a **completely interdisciplinary remit**.

The latter is designed to complement and **enhance the initial disciplinary profile** (called major) which, far from being ignored or diluted, is addressed and promoted throughout the course in relation to the different position profiles.

AlterEurope Master applicants can also enrol as part of continuing education after being selected by the academic board.
